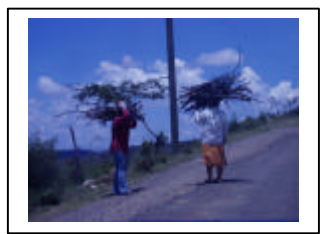




Tamara Prison-Tegucigalpa, Honduras



Riverbend Maximum Security Prison Nashville, TN.

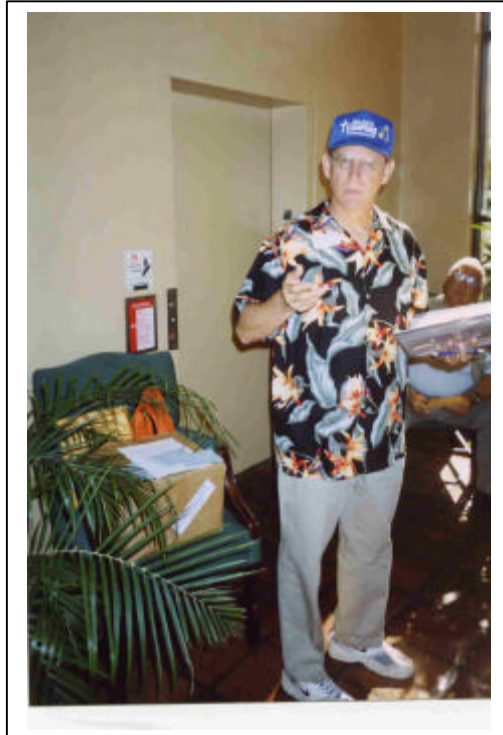

The bikers were allowed to ride the bikes inside the buildings including "death row." During this event we saw **64 men pray for salvation and we had a total of 158 positive decisions.**

Florida State Prison Maximum Security Prison (the end of the line) Gainesville, FL.



Joe and teammates preparing and training for three days in the Florida State Prison. This is the only facility in Florida that still is called a prison. This prison had 30+ men on "death row" and is known as "the end of the line" in the Florida State Penitentiary System. **We saw 16 men pray for salvation and had a total of 36 positive decisions.**



Lima, Peru
7 prisons and 13,000 inmates



We spent almost two weeks in Lima, Peru working in seven prisons with 13,000 men, woman and youth. We had about 30 folks from the United States and over 100 Peruvians working with us. This is the first time the Peruvian Government has allowed something like this in the prisons of that country.

God did in this South American country just what He can do anywhere at anytime. Here are the results of the history making event and the long lasting effect it will have in Lima, Peru,



Castro Castro Prison – **599 salvations**, 863 total decisions.

San Jorge Prison – **549 salvations**, 690 total decisions.

Luringancho – two days were spent here. This prison has 8,000 inmates. **2935 salvations**, 3792 total decisions.



Maranga Youth Prison – **389 salvations**, 403 total decisions,

Santa Monica Women's Prison – **635 salvations**, 810 total decisions.

Callao Prison – **486 salvations**, 548 total decisions.



Maranga Youth Female Prison – **35 salvations**, 41 total decisions.

Total – **5618 salvations**, 7141 total decisions.

We were allowed to take pictures inside these prisons so that I could share some of them here.



The story is the same here as in most every part of the world. No one has ever taken the time to tell these people about God's plan for their lives and Jesus Christ.
