I believe there is a verse in the Bible that speaks to that. Ha. Anyway, Mike Jones and I just got back from a trip to Guatemala March 14th. As is always the case, when you make plans to travel it is an exciting time. However as the time grows nearer, you begin thinking: “I really don’t have time for this and with all I need to be doing.” That is being obedient to one’s “true nature.” I did however make the trip with Drive-In Ministries Director Mike Jones. We visited and stayed with our friend Dr. Wilfred Johnson, long time Guate resident and Chancellor Emeritis of Guatemala Bible Seminary pictured here in the middle with Mike and me.



The very first night there I was visiting with Kirk and Michelle Lightfield, missionaries living there that put me up while I was there. During the conversation it came up of their recent trip to Memphis to St Jude and how they had helped a family from Mexico there for Leukemia treatment for their young child. To my surprise, I had a young lady from Mexico on my prayer list with Leukemia that needs the same treatment. By the next day, Kirk was in touch with our friend Henny Bodle and with the family of the little girl in Mexico about how to get to St Jude at their expense! This is what happens when one is “obedient to THE True God.” I’ll keep you posted on how this plays out. His ways are not our ways....

On Thursday morning, Wilfred arranged for me to do a program for the 440 students at Robinson School there in



Chimaltenango. It was a great group of kids and we had so much fun doing the program including presenting the Gospel in a way that is easy to understand and remember. Without great detail it uses three sponge balls and each one represents God, Man and sin and shows how sin separates man from God. That afternoon I saw one of the teachers of the 5 year old students. She told me one little boy had three balls of play dough, a pop cycle stick and was telling the others children about Dios (God) Diablo (Satan) and hombre. (man) A 5 year old retelling the Gospel story! That was Thursday and on



Saturday the government closed the schools! That is what happens when one is “Obedient to The True God!”



As I mentioned earlier, Mike and I got home late Friday the 13th and I didn’t get home until early on Saturday the 14th. That was the same day Guatemala closed the country to visitors from North America. That is how He does things when one is “obedient to THE True God” and not obedient to ones “true nature” which is always easier, and we tend to fall back on.

Speaking of The Mission of Hope, my Son Joe and I will be there on the 28th of March to start the first of the three-part fatherhood training. Pray for the residents there, for the leadership and the supporters.

Most everything we had planned has been rescheduled to later in the year once all this “social distancing” and “self-imposed quarantine” is over. We have lots to keep us busy until we are free to roam around and see our normal lives return. We are praying for this to pass quickly, for strength and wisdom for leaders, health care workers, store operators and people that are not working until we are able to get life back to normal.

We are using this time to finish construction of “The Gospel Parade” float we plan to use this year in several parades. It is based on Patti’s book, “The Gospel Parade” and will tell the good news in an easy to understand and powerful way to all who see it. More next month.
