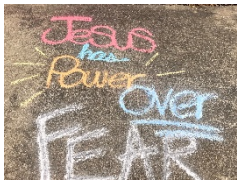

As this ongoing saga continues into the second month, I was thinking about Heaven vs Hell. The past 30 or so days for many seem like four forevers since things were normal. Imagine for a moment *eternity* spent somewhere! I was thinking about **Luke chapter 16: 19-25**. It's the story of "The Rich Man and Lazarus." I won't list it here, but I encourage you to read and think about it. One point in the story is in verse 22: "...the begger died and was carried by *angels* to Abraham's bosom. The rich man also died and was buried..." It is comforting to know that God sends *angels* to gather us up to Heaven and into His presence. We don't face death and eternity alone. Not so the case with the rich man. In verse 23 it says: "23 And being in torments in Hades, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. 24 "Then he cried and said, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus that he may dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame.'"

There is just no way to imagine an *eternity* in a place like that. Not only tormented in the flames forever but being able to see the people in the arms of Jesus, with no suffering, while their suffering continues, forever! *Eternity*, not 30 or 45 days.

Our Easter was different this year since we couldn't have all the children gathered here at one time. So Patti had the idea to have them come in small groups and they did, In fact we celebrated Easter on three different occasions. We had our neighbors Nicole and Joey's family on Sunday, Sarah and her family on Tuesday and Andrea and her family here on Thursday.
