Until then, I shall continue to do what He has called me to do! I’m not serving God for what He does, I’m serving Him because of what He has already done. He saved me, He brought be out of the darkness into His marvelous light, If He does nothing else, I will still love Him, and serve Him with my whole heart.”*
